Teaching Scholarship/ Professional Goals

As stated by Boyer (1990) scholarship cannot be narrowly defined into one category but involves four separate definable areas of focus including; discovery, teaching, application, and integration to be effective (AACN, 1991).

Discovery

Scholarship of discovery is achieved through a combination of primary empirical research, historical research, theory development, methodological studies, and philosophical inquiry (AACN, 1999).

Goal: Enhance with further develop technological skills related to faculty role transition.

Plan: Develop competency assessment development tool for use to assess and further enhance the technological skills necessary to effectively instruct in dynamic classroom setting. Technological skill development such as Oovoo Program software to enhance and promote real time live interaction between faculty and student, Camtasia Program software to promote the evolving classroom opportunities, and Adobe Presentation Software to allow the student to further enhance study techniques in a student centered environment.


