## Rationale

**RUSH UNIVERSITY**

- To address national mandates and nursing competencies for quality and patient safety as reflected in the NP and DNP essentials.
- The aging adult was selected as the population because of the APRN consensus model and its implications for APRN education, aging demographics, and the vulnerability of this population.

## Overall Course Purpose

- To prepare nurse leaders ready to create a culture of quality improvement and patient safety for the aging adult.
- To prepare nurse leaders to function as effective partners in inter-professional teams

## Scholarly Activities and Evaluation Methods

### Case study analysis

- Students analyze a complex case of an aging adult.
- Includes: identification of potential quality and safety issues; influences of physical, social, and psychological aging processes and effectiveness of the interprofessional team collaboration.

## Scholarly Activities and Evaluation Methods

RUSH UNIVERSITY

**Integrative review of the literature**

- Students select a quality improvement and/or patient safety issue for the aging adult.
- Synthesize the current evidence-base literature to describe the state of the science as well as to identify gaps and strengths to manage the issue.

## Scholarly Activities and Evaluation Methods

RUSH UNIVERSITY

**Application Paper**

- Students apply a selected quality improvement or safety model to the clinical issue investigated in the integrative review.
  - Evaluate national trends and influencing factors
  - Description of issue, rationale and system factors
  - Description and rationale for QI or patient safety process/model selected
  - Identify steps needed to apply process/model to improve issue

## Future Plans
