

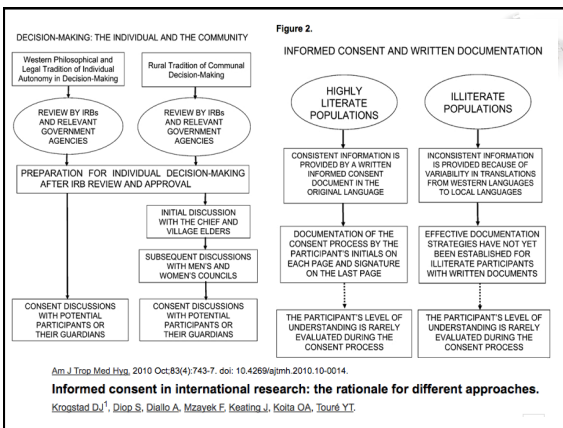


Office of Research Integrity

- ✓ Personal Convictions.

- ✓ **HONESTY** — conveying information truthfully and honoring commitments,
- ✓ **ACCURACY** — reporting findings precisely and taking care to avoid errors,
- ✓ **EFFICIENCY** — using resources wisely and avoiding waste, and
- ✓ **OBJECTIVITY** — letting the facts speak for themselves and avoiding improper bias.

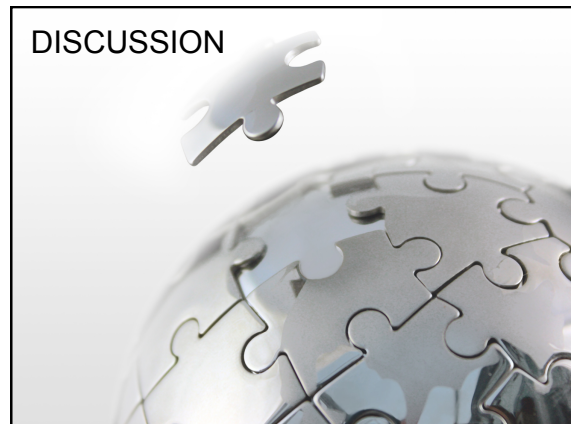

Grant Activity:	Assist with teaching, advising and assessment on undergraduate and postgraduate programs where curriculum is relevant to the scholar's research area, approximately 10-15 hours over a monthly period to class sizes that vary from 10-70. Collaborate with one of the school's four research teams on Maternal & Child Health, Chronic Illness Management (Child, Adolescent & Adult), Cancer Nursing, Healthy Aging, and Health Care Ethics. Actively engage in research, writing and publishing with faculty members, siting research in current best international practice in the field and presenting scholar's own research.
